Enrollment informed consent, demographic surve

Parenting Wisely (5 weeks): housework, schoolv criticizing/step-parenting, monitoring (school, home friends), loud music/chores, sharing tech, sibling c getting up on time, finding drugs

Mid-session interview: open ended, semi-structu assess parents' initial impressions of PW ; content

End of study interview: explore what parents lear PW, overall satisfaction with the content, timing of and mode of delivery; content analysis

Usability survey: module completion, clarity, usef spent completing modules

Practicing communication: "If my son acts up, everyone's quick to just say take away the cell phone, but not having an actual consequence. Like this is your warning. If you're going to do this,

Parent alignment: "We had a family meeting to talk about some rules. And if we hadn't been watching the modules, I think one of us could've taken something personally...because I remember, at one point, we were all talking and my husband actually pulled back and said, "Hang on. Let's just have one person talk at a time."...We even said, "Remember what the module said about this?" If I had done it by myself, I would've spent so much time trying to explain it to him and then felt isolated trying to run a family meeting or something. It was just so much better."

The role of prevention: "This program needs to be used in the beginning when they are identified as having markers that show that they are at risk for mental and behavioral health issues when they are assessed to be at risk for substance use and juvenile justice issues; this should be implemented immediately."

<u>Timing of delivery:</u> "I think it depends on where [parents] are. The people who are new to treatment, you can tell they're a little bit in rough shape. They're looking for an answer versus people like myself, who we've been doing this for a long time."

<u>Representativeness: "a nice variety of family structures...It's not all</u> white middle class families. I can tell that there's been some effort

Relatability: "[my] kids' responses are much more extreme than what's in the video...even if the conflict is familiar, the reaction of the kids was way less." OR "The areas of conflict in our home were well-represented. This has played out in our home exactly"

Parents may need support implementing more difficult skills such as contingency management interventions
