Extensive file material from 30 years of child protection activities in Düsseldorf:

- approx. 5000 case files from an outpatient Child Protection Diagnostic Center (CPDC) (1985-2014)
- > 400 Concept documents of the outpatient Child Protection Diagnostic Centre (CPDC) (1985-2014)
- **900 corresponding individual case files** of the Youth Welfare Office (2005-2014)
- 8 biographical interviews (2019-2020)





Grounded theory methodology: qualitative analysis of 32 case records from the outpatient Child Protection Diagnostic Centre (CPDC)





Refuges help to survive

"Clouds condensed on many fronts" (Z. 313 f.)



"So it's always like this, even [...] with the medical child protection organization, it's always so divided. I'm, I'm infinitely grateful, ne (I: mhm) and I would never negate that. I mean, everything that could have helped me during that time, I absorbed like a sponge and um (--) yes, but some things, you still slip through"(Larissa Z. 349-351)


Separation as salvation

"Yes, because I basically went my own way more with my parents than with outside help, I'll put it that way. (..) (.hhh) So I don't know (.) how long I was there in the child protection outpatient clinic, (..) (.hhh) but even if I did, I actually learnt more from my family here than from outside help" (Klara Z. 264-267)

Summary and conclusion

- Children and young people want to be protected effectively and sustainably; they want their everyday lives to be noticeably improved through help and intervention.
- Children and young people experience child protection processes positively and, if something has really been done for them, as a place and life experience of effective protection.
- Children and young people think in terms of people, not organizations; they need and want support, time and consistency.
- Children and young people can experience child protection as an area of empowerment, self-efficacy and autonomy
