




# WEBINAR GOALS

#### **GOALS** for this Webinar:


- To provide viewers with information/important strategies that will increase their knowledge about how to improve successful family-driven care program practices and staff skills.

# Focus areas Michigan Stakeholders shared are important to them about Family-driven care

- Staff skills and program practices for engaging and supporting families in being an active part of all aspects of their children's care, treatment, and support
- Understanding cultural differences in terms of engaging families
- Providing education/skill building for family members to learn how to better support their children
- Engaging familial supports when there is no plan for reunification (common for CI/DD population)





## Every Michigan residential program has done good work specific to family-driven care program practices and staff skills, and focused in different ways on promoting family voice, choice & skills.

# Examples of FDC strategies different MI residential leaders shared that they have successfully implemented

- Encouraging daily phone calls with family
- Provides an iPad to do zoom visits with family supports
- The program helps drive kids to and from time spent with family
- The Therapist has supervised sibling visits
- The program works with DHHS to find birth/adoptive family
- Engage the families in weekly/bi weekly family sessions
- Ensure youth spend time in the community and home long before the youth is discharged home
- Keep families informed about program updates
- Work to overcome travel obstacles to youth spending time at home
- Use multiple different methods to maintain family contact
