- Be hard like water, be soft like water.
- Leadership should reflect the people being led and population being served.
- Know your worth, don't second guess your experiences of implicit and explicit bias, know that even White liberals can be racist-they can't help themselves!
- You are more powerful than you know.
- Your worth is not measured by your productivity. This work can easily deplete you, find ways to recharge and take care of yourself.
- Find your village and collaborate with them to get things done. Do not attempt to go at it alone if you do not have to.
- Be true to you!
- The higher you go the lonelier it gets. Connect with other BIPOC folks in your same role in other organizations to help build you up.
- When preparation meets opportunity, there is success. That opportunity can be at another organization.
- Learn thyself, know thyself and be open to changing thyself when it no longer serves you!
- Stand up and don't let your voice be silenced.
- You alone are enough.
- Be courageous and encourage courage on your team.
- Invest in yourself because your professional development is your responsibility.
- Diversity, inclusion, and making someone feel like their value can go a long way.
- Always believe in yourself, stay positive even during tough situations, pitch your ideas in a way that creates diversity and inclusion, and believe that the goals you set are achievable.
- Be the leader, be the voice that promotes change that will make a difference, POWER of self.
- Those who came before us had to acquiesce to leave the door open and create space for us. Now we have to speak up to continue to create space for those who will come behind us.
- Keep shining through the rain.
- Don't give up.
- Understand your relevance, impact and influence factor.

The responses below did not have a source attributed upon submission, and are believed to be original thoughts from the respondents.

- Racism is a profound deviation from the standard of true morality. It deprives a portion of humanity
 of the opportunity to cultivate and express the full range of their capability and to live a meaningful
 and flourishing life, while blighting the progress of the rest of humankind. It cannot be rooted out by
 contest and conflict. It must be supplanted by the establishment of just relationships among
 individuals, communities, and institutions of society that will uplift all and will not designate anyone
 as "other". The change required is not merely social and economic, but above all moral and
 spiritual.
- Racialized white people must be willing to put their full humanity on the table. The job requires
 them to dig into their own genesis story of coming to the US. Most racialized white people did not
 land on this continent as "white". They became "white". Otherwise, they are engaging in racialized
 porn and voyeurism.
- "Trust your own judgment." Also, with respect to written communications: "Review, reflect and, if
 necessary, revise." Word of advice: Never send an email on impulse or emotion in response to a
 given situation that touches a nerve or upsets you. Write it, then think on it before sending it out.
- Find and connect to other BIPOC leaders, don't worry if they work in different industries or non-profit spaces that are dissimilar from your work setting, you will find in the coming together and sharing these colleagues can help you to navigate the experience as they are likely facing similar challenges. We can support one another.
- No one will ever be more invested in your professional development and growth than you!
 Organizational leaders will make decisions based on what they think is best for the organization so it's important that BIPOC leaders make decisions based on what's best for them and their career.
